Frank Wellington

Perhaps the best known early photograph and postcard scene of the village is the one that has been hanging in the Chequers for many years and is on this month's front cover. The man in the car is Frank Wellington. The photo was taken in 1906 and at the time he lived in Danbury, but was related to the local Page family who were farmers. In his day Frank was a very well known automotive engineer, vehicle manufacturer, dealer, motor and motorcycle racing enthusiast.

In 1897 he was photographed driving "the first car through Goldhanger" (PM cover photo and article in Sept. Last year), and had registered a patent for "Variable Gearing" for a motor vehicle.

In 1900 he began production of the "Wellington car" in London and was winner of the Crystal Palace "Brassard" race, beating all previous records. In that year he was also chairman of the Motor Car Club, which became the Royal Automobile Club (RAC) in 1907.

Between 1900-1910 he was a member of the management committee of the Motor Users Defence Association, an organisation set up to protect motorists against legal actions. It merged with the Automobile Association (AA) in 1910.

Between 1900 & 1914 there were numerous adverts for F. Wellington Cars Ltd, many associated with Dutch built Spyker cars.

In 1903 he published a book: "How to Buy a Second hand Car".

From 1905 onwards he raced Spyker cars throughout the UK.

In 1907 he became the manager of Spyker Cars in Amsterdam.

In 1910 Frank Wellington & Bowring Ltd, opened showrooms in Great Portland Street, London.

Frank died in 1917, aged 49 after a motoring accident and in 1924 his business, which also had a showroom in Torquay, was dissolved.

One of the two main cars used in the 1953 film "Genevieve", which was about the London to Brighton run, was a 1905 Spyker. As the main importers of this car, F. Wellington Cars Ltd probably sold it originally. This actual car last did the London to Brighton run in 2013 and it is now in a museum in The Hague, Holland.

Expensive sports cars are still produced by Spyker in Holland today.



But you'll still have a fabulous four.


Will you stop nagging me woman?





GOLDHANGER PARISH COUNCIL

Report on the Ordinary Meeting held on 10.4.2018

Planning

The following decisions by Maldon District Council were noted:

North Maldon Growers Ltd Lt Totham Road – prior notification for the erection of an agricultural building – refused.

20 Fish Street – Scots Pine Tree Preservation Order – this Order became provisionally effective on 19.3.2018 and remains so until confirmed otherwise within the period of six months from this date.

There were no new planning applications to consider.

Maldon District Council will be asked about the progress of various enforcement issues in the parish.

There will shortly be a vacancy on the Council as Chris Joslin has announced his intention to resign in May. Please contact either the clerk or the Chair of the Council if you are interested in becoming a Councillor. Councillor Mr Joslin was thanked for all his hard work over the past years.

Councillor Mark Durham (Chair of the Local Highways Panel) has been advised of various outstanding highways issues in the parish – blocked drains in Head Street and flooding arising from water run off in Little Totham Road which causes problems further down in Maldon Road.

The passing places in Little Totham Road have still not been repaired after damage was caused by Highways vehicles working in the area.

It was noted that there are two allotment vacancies – please apply to Councillor Mr Cheeseman if you are interested in taking these up.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Tuesday 8th May at 7.30 pm. Maldon District Council's Waste Education Officer will give a short talk on "Where Does The Waste Go?" and everyone is welcome to attend.

The Annual Parish Assembly then followed, and Councillor Mark Durham (Essex County Councillor and leader of Maldon District Council) addressed the meeting. He advised that this was a very difficult time for local authorities due to financial restraints – the central government grant has been reduced and councils have to try and do more with less resources. Adult and social care takes up a very large proportion of the total funding, and the upkeep of roads is a hugely costly issue.

The Local Highways Panel budget has been cut by fifty per cent, and shortage of funding is a basic issue. It is hoped that some re-organisation will speed up the delivery of schemes.

Councillor Durham stated that the traffic calming scheme for Maldon Road in Goldhanger will definitely be delivered in the year 2018-2019, but that no further work will take place on the Charity Farm bends as the accident statistics do not merit this. The 20mph speed limit for Fish Street was dropped because under new rules there can only be a 20mph limit if there is also traffic calming measures in place, and the speed survey that was undertaken showed that the speed of most vehicles was in fact very low.

The Parish Council advised that there was an urgent need for the traffic calming measures in Maldon Road, and that drainage at the Charity Farm bends remains an issue and there are frequent accidents at this location.

Councillor Durham advised that parking restrictions are being applied for at the shop opposite Heybridge Church, where traffic often builds up due to road obstructions. The new relief road linking Broad Street Green and Langford is tied in with the proposed development of this area and the road must be in place before the houses are built.

The issue of narrow bridges in the area which cause traffic obstructions was raised, but Councillor Durham said it was unlikely that these could be altered due to lack of funding. There was also little possibility of the re-opening of the old rail link between Maldon and Witham.

Councillor Durham urged residents to report any potholes to Essex County Council, and verified that claims can be made for damage to vehicles caused by potholes.

The report by the Chair of Goldhanger Parish Council now follows.

GOLDHANGER PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

April 7th 2018

This is the Chairman's report of Parish Council activities over the past year.

1. Council Composition

Rachel Smith joined the Parish Council in May last year.
Other positions have remained the same.

2. Planning

There have been various applications for the council to consider and report their view to Maldon District Council, who make the decisions.

Maldon have changed some of their planning procedures this year, including losing the 'parish trigger', this means that while the Parish Council remain consultees, the decision remains with the designated planning officer and not referred to planning committee, which was the default position previously if the Parish had any objections to a particular planning submission.

Additionally MDC have gone 'paperless' so the Parish council no longer receive paper copies of planning applications.

New housing applications have been as follows:

- None in this period although works are ongoing on the new developments in Maldon Road and Church Street.

Extensions and Minor Works comprised:

- Clockmakers, 2 Head St, extension - Supported & approved
- 27 Maldon Road, 2 storey extension (2nd application) - Supported & approved
- The Stumble, 4A Church st, 2 storey extension - Supported & approved
- 23 Maldon Road, retrospective loft extension - Supported & refused
- Village Hall, extension & improvements - Supported & approved

The MDC Local Development Plan

The Plan was completed and adopted.

3. Bus Service

Last year Goldhanger residents campaigned hard to retain our bus service after the closure of the Tollesbury bus depot, this year I would add while the County Council has an obligation to support rural routes, these ‘supported’ services (our weekend service is a supported service) get regularly reviewed and assessed on user numbers, if user numbers are low then frequency of services are often reduced. This can often result, over time, in a spiral of reduction of users and hence services. Some local rural buses are reduced to only a few buses a week. So my message put simply – Continue to use it or lose it.

4. Highways

There were 3 Parish schemes within the Local Highways Panel remit as reported last year progress has only been negative in nature:

- Maldon Road traffic calming. MDC have proposed speed roundals painted on the road, Local Highways Panel have “re-profiled” this scheme into the programme for 2017-18. (no change to report from Last year!)
- Charity Farm Bends safety improvements – 2 signs have been erected but we don’t consider this closed out and no proposals have been received for the drainage improvements required. (no change to report from Last year!)
- Fish Street 20mph -since approved last year, the scheme has been removed from the list and monies reallocated to Wickham Bishops.

Parking within the village

The parking restrictions in Fish Street and the corners of the junction within the Square were put in place last summer. At the same time, a number of parking bays with a 3 hour limit, no return within 6 hours were created near to the playing field.

South Essex Parking Partnership carry out enforcement and we have increased the budget this year to ensure these bays are not abused.

Accidents

Again this year we have seen a number of accidents in our Parish on the road between Wash Bridge and our boundary on the D’arcy side

We remain keen to keep track of accidents as this data is not held by any other parties. Collecting this data will give us an evidence base which we can call upon, should we request any safety improvement works in the future.

So please email myself or other Councillors details of any accidents you may see.

5. Playing Field, Woodland and Leisure

Replacement goalposts and 2 new benches were installed by members of the Parish Council during this last year.

We are considering park path improvement works along the park to the seawall but quotes obtained to date are disproportionate to our annual income from precept and so we need to consider funding applications.

The play equipment inspection showed that some play equipment could benefit from replacing, an amount has been put aside in the budget for this.

Marigold Wood, we are planning to add the scope of grass cutting around the path to our current scope of grass cutting.

Councillor Clive Cheesman has continued to administer the allotments and if you are interested in having a plot, please contact him.

Natural England are undertaking a programme to implement the government initiative to produce a continuous walking route around England's coastline. (part of the Marine and Coastal Act 2009).

The Maldon to Salcot stretch which includes Goldhangers seawall, has obtained Secretary of State approval for the access proposals put forward by Natural England, who are administering the Coastal path, and it is due to be completed in 2018.

6. Neighbourhood Watch

Malcolm Holmes with his team has continued to keep us all informed of the latest scams and circulated relevant Police crime reports for the Maldon District. Please see the Parish Magazine for further details and contact Malcolm if you wish to receive emails.

7. Precept

The Precept is a tax charged on each property in the Parish to fund the activities the Parish Council undertake for the benefit of the community, our budget is mainly taken up with our legal obligations associated with Parish assets, and can be found on your Council tax bill. The Parish Council work hard to keep this as low as possible for residents.

The Precept for 2017/18 was £7,800 and has been increased this coming year 18/19 to £13,200 which includes the pledged £5000 towards the village Hall improvements and general increases in our recurring expenditure.

In view of our low turnover it is considered prudent to maintain one year's expenditure in reserve for the unexpected.

8. Defibrillators

2 defibrillators were installed in the village last Spring, one in the phone box in the square and the other in the phone box in Maldon road.

An awareness session was held last summer and another is planned this year.

Plaques are planned to be installed in each phone box to thank all those who have made donations.

The Parish Council plan to enhance the 'red' phone box by painting it and by replacing the 'cloudy' panes of Perspex with new panes.

The light in the box on the main road has been fixed.

9. Village Hall

While the Village Hall is a separate committee, the hall is an important element to our village, community and the Parish Council, who are reliant on its availability for meetings. The village hall improvement plans were approved last year and a start date for February 2019 is anticipated.

The plans for improvement of the village hall facilities require a lot of work and fund raising by the Village Hall committee and I would encourage all residents to support events.

10. Legal obligations

New General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) come into force in May and our Clerk has attended training to ensure our procedures are compliant.

I would like to thank Vysian, our Clerk, for another year of devoted service supporting and guiding us, and all Councillors for their dedicated work which enables us to continue to minimise the precept.

With a special mention to Chis Joslin who has put in many years valued service and plans to step down in May to focus on other commitments.



Recipe of the month
