The Romans at Goldhanger

Historians and archaeologists have always been keen to uncover Roman remains.

Here are some extracts from the local archives.

"Essex" - By J Charles Cox, published in 1909

Anglo-Saxons - The swarms of uncultured and inartistic denizens of Northern Europe that crossed the seas to this county soon after the departure of the Romans have naturally left far fewer traces behind them than did their predecessors. Mr Reginald Smith has been able to chronicle only the places where interments of these early settlers have been noted - namely, at Broomfield, Great Clacton, Colchester, Goldhanger, Heybridge, Kelvedon, Leigh, Shoeburyness and Leigh.

A POSSIBLE ROMAN ROAD AT GREAT BRAXTED, ESSEX

Aerial photography in 1984 produced some indications of the possible existence of a Roman road at Great Braxted. The position of such a Roman road is that if it continued in the same direction the obvious destination would be the prolific Iron Age and Romano-British 'Red Hill' salt production sites at Tolleshunt D'Arcy, Tollesbury and Goldhanger. In particular it would arrive at the coast in the immediate vicinity of the large Red Hill at Lauriston Farm, which was excavated by F.W. Reader in 1907. Not far away was his other excavated hill at Coastguard Marsh, Goldhanger. Both these sites produced Roman pottery in addition to earlier Iron Age material.

Goldhanger Creek gives up a secret

An ancient boat, believed to be Roman, has been un-earthed in Goldhanger Creek by Mr. H. Crawshay Frost. He was investigating some very old oak stakes which protruded from the mud, resembling the supports of a pier, when he found a huge oak beam, 27 ft. long, resembling the keel timber of a large boat. The whole length of the beam had been hollowed out.

The ancient Romans used quite large ships, and the Emperor Augustus is reputed to have visited England in A.D. 44 bringing many elephants to overawe the Britons.

It is thought the oak stakes still sticking out of the mud may have supported a landing stage and quay at which the Romans could load their boats with corn, etc.

Roman remains

AT the pleasantly named village of Goldhanger, on what are called the Red Hills, there existed in Roman times a number of ovens used in the manufacture of bricks and pottery.

As recently as 1947 remnants of a Roman pier from which boats were loaded with corn and pottery were found in Goldhanger creek. The remains - several oak stakes and spars - were thought to be the only surviving example of a Roman pier in this country.

The History of St. Peters Church Building

St. Peters Church is thought to date from the 11th century, probably having been built before the Survey of the 1086 for the Domesday Book.

Of interest are the Roman tiles and bricks in the walls of the east end, material which may have come from the Romano British building said to have stood in Fish Street.







Report of the remote Ordinary Meeting held on 14.7.2020

Planning

The following decisions by Maldon District Council were noted:

14 Hall Estate – erection of a part single and part two storey rear and side extension. **Refused.**

Cobbs Farm Maldon Road – application to continue the construction of an agricultural reservoir by extracting and removing sand, gravel and surplus soils, and to continue the use of a washing plant until 20th September 2021. **No objections.**

Inglenook 52 Maldon Road – proposed new garden building. **Approved.**

The following new applications were considered:

Cobbs Farm Maldon Road – erection of additional livestock building with associated area of hard standing and feed bin. Although the Parish Council has no objection to this application there is concern at the ongoing smell from the pig units at this site.

Gardeners Farm Maldon Road – change of use of stables to overnight dog kennels with associated hydrotherapy pool, feed store, external exercise enclosure and fenced external walkway. The Parish Council objects as the application contains various inaccuracies; there is the potential for noise disturbance from barking dogs; there is an absence of information on how overnight supervision will be addressed. Due to the extensive planning history of this site with enforcement notices being issued, it is felt that a comprehensive on-site check of planning compliance should be undertaken before any consideration is made of the current application.

Playing field

The play area has now been re-opened following consultation on government guidelines and with the insurance company. A Risk Assessment was carried out before re-opening.

Highways

A number of complaints have been received at the way in which cones have been used to discourage parking in various places in the village. The cones have now been moved into the kerb.

Parking inspectors visited the village recently and will continue to patrol in Fish Street.

Councillor Mr Sargeant is continuing to follow up on flooding issues in the village.

Village sign

The sign has been taken down and is now being repaired and repainted.

The next remote meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Tuesday 11th August at 7.30 pm.

Recipe of the month

Courgette & caramelised red onion tart

Prep time **20 mins**
Cooking time **35 mins**
Serves 4



Ingredients

Plain flour for dusting
375g block of puff pastry
1 egg beaten
50g butter
3 large red onions, sliced
2 tbsp balsamic vinegar
1 tsp ground coriander
1 large courgette cut in thin ribbons with a vegetable peeler
100g goat's cheese
Mixed green salad to serve

Method

Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. On a lightly floured surface, roll the pastry out to slightly smaller than an A4 rectangle. Slide onto a baking tray, brush with the beaten egg and cook for 20 mins or until golden.

Meanwhile, melt the butter in a frying pan over a medium heat. Once foaming, add the onions with a pinch of salt. Cook, stirring regularly, for 10 mins until soft. Pour in the balsamic and cook for a further 6-8 mins until sticky and caramelised.

Spoon over the pastry, then top with the courgette ribbons and blobs of goat's cheese. Return to the oven for 15 mins until the cheese is bubbling. Serve with the salad.

DWP has experienced a huge increase in claims and our phone lines have been extremely busy as a result. We have taken urgent action to boost capacity, by moving large numbers of existing staff to help our front line colleagues, and we're recruiting more.

New claims to Universal Credit should be [done online where possible](#). Customers do not need to call DWP to arrange an appointment and they shouldn't attend the Jobcentre.

People making new claims for Universal Credit no longer need to call DWP as part of the process. Instead, a bolstered team are calling claimants back if they need to check any of the information provided as part of the claim. This change has been in effect since 9 April. It should free up phone lines for those unable to claim online.

All of this will mean our staff can make more calls, ensure claims are progressed as quickly as possible and get much needed support to those who need it.
