Haywain Wagons in Goldhanger

This month's front cover picture shows two haywain type wagons outside the village school that are about to take the children on an outing in around 1900. We also have a copy of a news article from the *Essex Newsman* dated 1893 entitled SCHOOL TREAT...

The article tells us that the children were conveyed to the hall in wagons lent by local farmers: the Revd Leigh of Old Rectory Farm, Mr Bunting of Highams Farm and Mr Wakelin of Follyfaunts Farm.

SCHOOL TREAT.—On the 7th inst. the children of the National Schools at Goldhanger and Little Totham were entertained at an excellent treat at Little Totham Hall, the residence of Mr. F. Wakelin. The Goldhanger children, under the superintendence of Mr., Mrs., and Miss Branch, were conveyed to the hall in wagons, kindly lent by Messrs. F. B. Leigh, J. Bunting, and F. Wakelin. Miss Pennington had already arrived with the Little Totham contingent.

Here is an extract from the parish magazine of 1904...

“The children went to the Sunday school Christmas treat at the Rectory in a horse and cart. The repast being over, the curtains at one end of the room were drawn aside revealing the lighted Christmas tree laden with presents of which every child received one or two”.

By a coincidence we also have a copy of a photograph taken in 1934 of a traction engine with a wagon at Highams Farm that looks remarkably similar...



By another coincidence Highams Farm held an auction of unwanted machinery in 2001 and a similar Haywain style wagon was an item up for sale. Members of the Goldhanger History Group bravely went along to the sale with the intentions of bidding for the wagon to keep it in the village and had a budget of £1000. The wagon sold for £12,000 (woodworm included) to a farmer in Suffolk who told us he collected this type of wagon as a hobby and didn't have an Essex built one.



Here is a photo of the wagon that was for sale in 2001. The cast iron plaque on the front had:

Ministry Team Message February 2021

Life continues to change at a pace, and in a way that I suspect few of us would have imagined back in the summer. As England goes back into an almost March 2020-level of lockdown.

I see hope on the horizon, the first person in the UK who is 82 receives the new Oxford Covid vaccine, we now see another glimmer of hope even though it will take several months for our NHS to roll out the vaccine into our communities.

I always seem to have my hope restored as the start of February gets closer. We can see an end to the dark days of December and January slowly passing by. Our gardens start to come back to life, Snowdrops, Daffodils, Crocuses and many other plants and trees start to show signs of life once again. For me being a keen gardener, it is an exciting time and as someone who enjoys the countryside, it gives me hope as I start to plan what I will try to grow in my garden and allotment during the next growing season.

Lord you now have set your servant free to go in peace as you have promised.

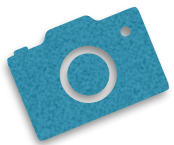
For these eyes of mine have seen the saviour, whom you have prepared for all the world to see: A light to enlighten the nations, and the glory of your people Israel.

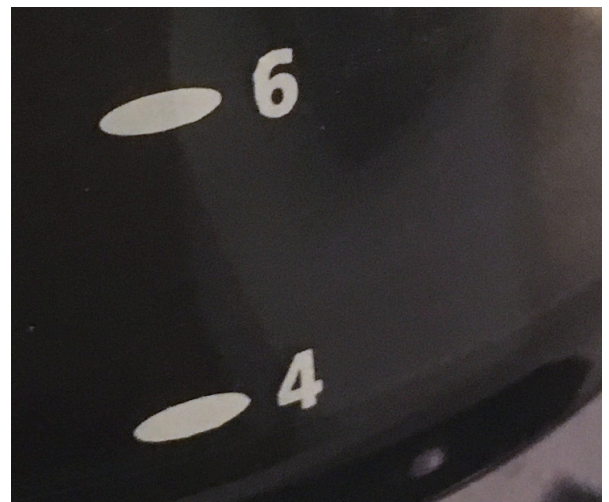

If you don't use the internet

Many in Goldhanger use the internet to get information. Email notifications, like both Goldhanger Neighbourhood Watch (goldhangernw@outlook.com) and Goldhanger Matters (goldhangermatters@outlook.com), help keep villagers informed about local issues. For example, Goldhanger Matters sends out emails to let you know when pink and green recycling and food bags are available at the Village Hall. Because they are both secure systems, they are a safe and very efficient way of getting to know what is going on in the village.

However, some of you don't use the internet and can miss information you would like to know. To help you there are two possibilities.

Firstly, you can ask a relative or friend to get the emails and they can tell you if there is something they think you should know. They don't need to live in the village and can contact you by phone when they get an email.

Secondly, you can give me a call and let me know you would like to be added to the information list. We can then phone you when something seems relevant to you, like the recycling bags or if there is a threat from scammers.

Recipe of the month

Easy Sausage Casserole

Quick, cheap and tasty

Serves 4

Ingredients

8 sausages
1 onion, diced
1 garlic clove, chopped
1 tsp dried mixed herbs
1 x 400g/14oz tin butter beans, rinsed and drained
½ bunch parsley, roughly chopped
400g/14oz tin chopped tomatoes
500ml/18fl oz chicken stock, made from stock cube
salt and freshly ground black pepper



For the herby crumb topping

100g/3½oz bread (ideally day old), crusts removed
½ bunch parsley, finely chopped
1 tbsp olive oil

Method

- 1) Preheat the oven to 200C/180C Fan/Gas 6.
- 2) Heat a large frying pan over a medium heat. Once hot, add the sausages and cook for 6-8 minutes, turning now and again to colour evenly.
- 3) Add the onion and continue to cook for three minutes, then add the garlic and dried herbs and cook for two more minutes, stirring from time to time.
- 4) Meanwhile, for the herby crumb topping, tear the bread into small crumbs (or put into a food processor if you have one) and mix it with the finely chopped parsley.
- 5) Add the butter beans, parsley, tomatoes and chicken stock to the pan. Stir to mix everything together and season well with salt and pepper. Transfer to a medium-sized ovenproof baking dish.
- 6) Sprinkle the herby crumbs evenly over the surface of the stew, drizzle with olive oil, season with salt and pepper and bake for 25 minutes, or until the topping is crisp. Serve while hot.

GOLDHANGER PARISH COUNCIL

Report of the remote Ordinary Meeting held on 13.1.2021

Planning

Decisions by Maldon District Council:

19 Blind Lane – double garage with room in roof to the front of existing dwelling house. Approved.

30 Fish Street – T1 walnut, reduce the crown all around by 2m. Allowed to proceed.

1 Head Street – demolition of existing dwelling and erection of new replacement dwelling and outbuilding. Refused.

2 Fish Street – T1 maple, remove 6 lower branches going west over the oak. Remove 1 lower branch going east over the car park. Remove 1 lower branch going south over 2 East Street. Allowed to proceed.

New amended application Orchard View 1a Head Street – dwelling, cafe, shop, B&B.

The Parish Council's initial response remains the same but comments were made on the new information provided.

Maldon District Council is still investigating a number of enforcement issues in the parish but no further update has been received.

Maldon District Heritage Assets

This scheme means that if any planning application comes up on a heritage asset it would need to be considered in the planning process. This is ongoing and a further report will be made at the February meeting.

Budget and precept

The Council discussed the draft budget put forward as well as possible new schemes for 2021/2022. After a suggestion was made by a resident that a new Speed Indicator Device could be put up at the other end of the village it was agreed that the existing SID could be spun round to face the other way. Work on the path from Fish Street to the sea wall would require the use of a digger to even up the surface and clear away excess vegetation, with gravel then being put down on the surface of the path. It was agreed that some thinning of the vegetation in Marigold Wood will shortly take place using a contractor. Councillor Mrs Bourn will approach the Environment Agency about putting in a new handrail on the steps up to the sea wall.

The budget was then approved and the precept for 2021/2022 set at £9,250.

Playing field and play area

Quotes have been obtained for a new slide in the play area and it was agreed that a slide and two springers should be ordered.

It was noted that there is a tent on the edge of the playing field by the Bounds Farm boundary. It is not known if this is being used by a rough sleeper but Councillors will investigate.

Highways

Due to lockdown there is no news about training for a new Community Speed Watch group.

The Council is still trying to get various agencies to take responsibility for drainage problems in Head Street and Maldon Road but to date there has been little success although Councillor Mark Durham from Essex County Council has now made a response and a reply is expected from Moat in mid January.

Wash Bridge Maldon Road.

The Environment Agency will be asked to clarify whether it is themselves or the landowner who is responsible for keeping the brook clear of vegetation.

Village pump

Repair work to the village pump has now taken place, and a quote for further work is awaited.

Superfast Broadband

This has now reached its target in the village and residents are encouraged to pledge their support.

Blind Lane hedge.

The hedge opposite the houses in Blind Lane has now been cut by the land owner.

Government advice continues to be that Parish Councils should not hold face to face meetings for the near future. The next remote meeting of the Parish Council will therefore be held on Wednesday 10th February 2021 at 7.30 pm, and interested residents are welcome to participate. 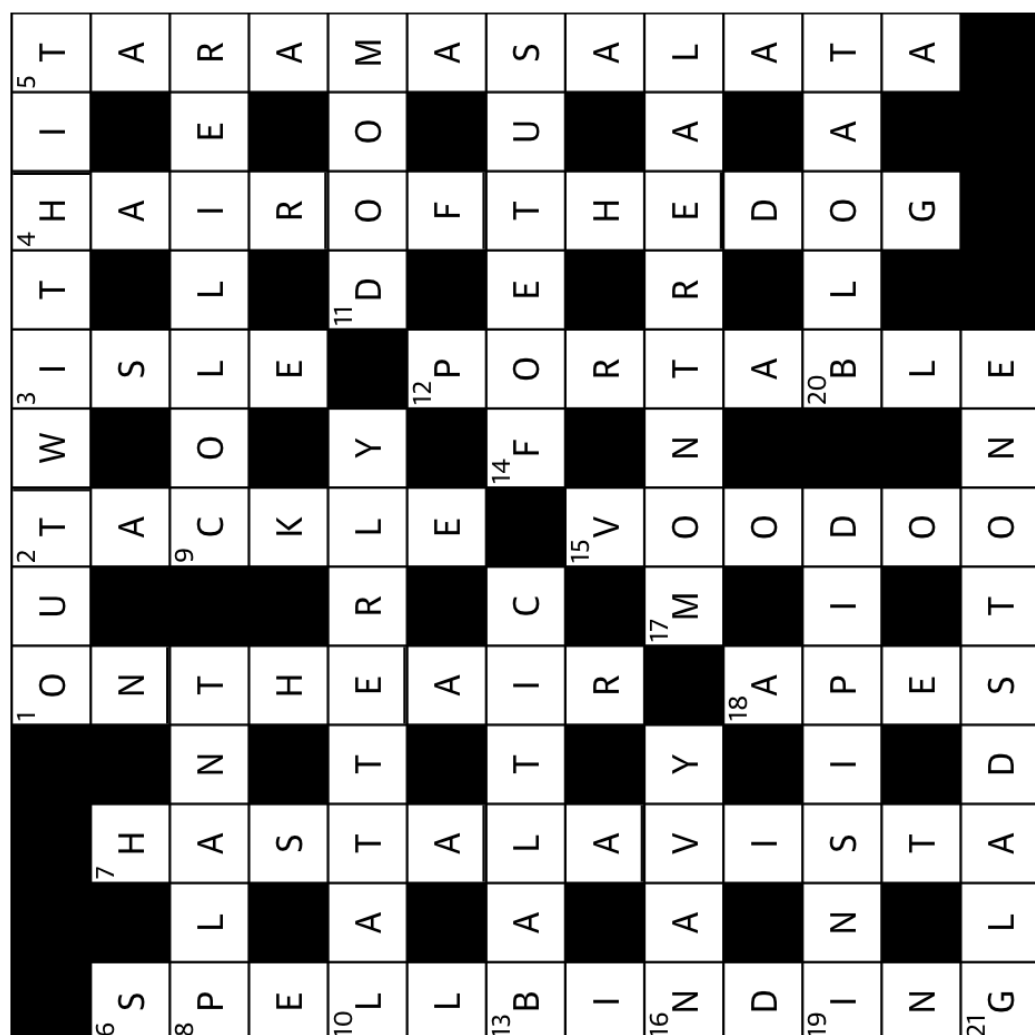

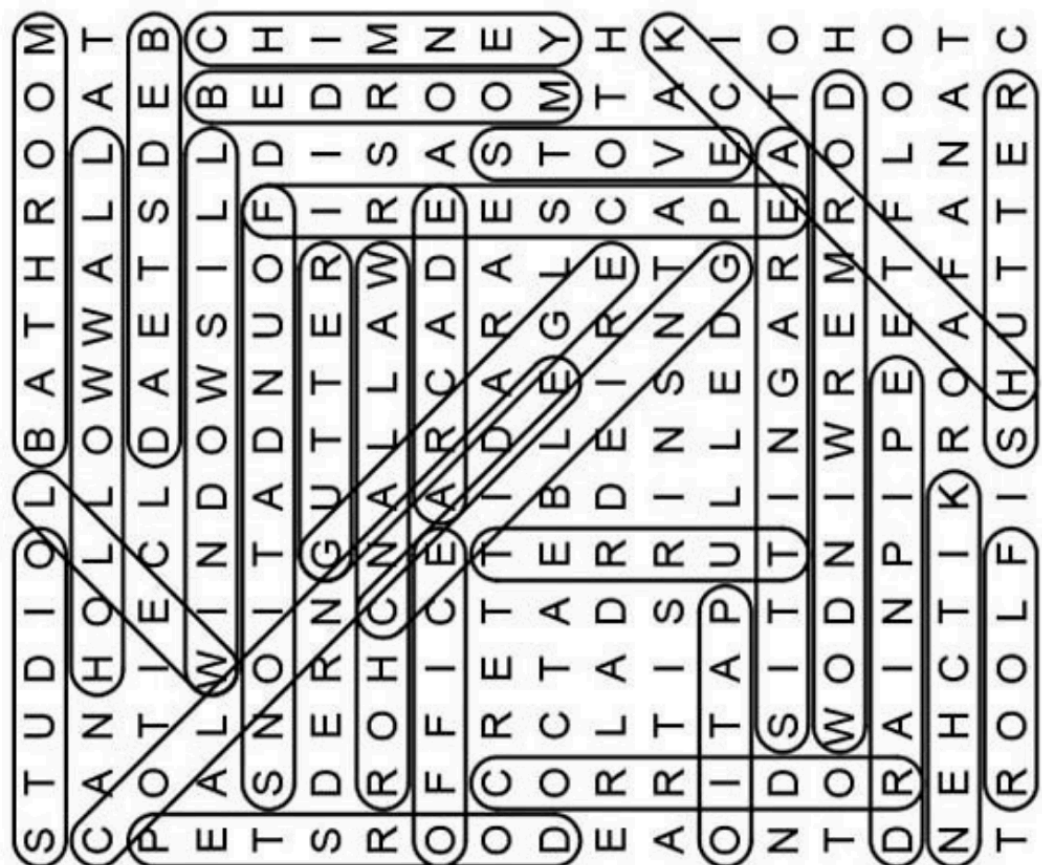

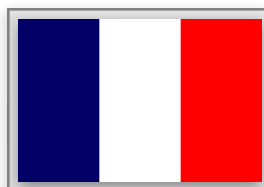
