



Accredited Site Based Heritage Building Training

Hello everyone,

We have only had four volunteers come forward since January, so the Parish Council can not pursue this scheme further. If there are 10 volunteers willing to participate in this scheme in the future we can re-apply to join the scheme.

We have also seen concerns posted online about speeding in the village. Over the years the Parish Council have applied to Highways for various schemes to reduce traffic speeds, in particular on the main road. However, the last scheme proposed by highways was to increase the speed at the D'Arcy end of the village which the Parish Council successfully appealed!

One way to build a case for any future scheme is to collate an evidence base, one way this can be achieved is from collected speed data.

If anyone is interested in being part of a community speed watch group please email the Parish Council Clerk.

I enclose the commitments of the group below, however you will note that one unresolved issue is the provision of the equipment.

- Number of volunteers required : Minimum of ten, ideally more, as we recommend that monitoring takes place in groups of three.
- Commitment of volunteers : There are no restrictions and we ask volunteers to do whatever they feel comfortable with. Each group works their own rota depending on availability of volunteers.
- Coordinator : Each group will need a dedicated person to coordinate them. This person will be responsible for the equipment, the volunteers and ensuring log sheets are completed and returned to the police for processing.
- Sites : Ideally there should be a minimum of two sites within the community. These should be in a 30mph or 40mph zone. They must be evaluated and approved as being suitable for CSW activities. Sites must be visible, consideration must be given to the safety of volunteers and motorists when choosing sites. There must be a safe place to stand off the road which does not obstruct any pedestrian right of way. If there are no pavements you may be able to use a village green or wide verge. Access to that site must be safe, do not expect volunteers to walk along the road or put themselves at risk at any time. Where can volunteers park if they have to drive to the site? You don't want them parked in the line of vision? Signage needs to be placed approximately 100 meters in each direction and in a suitable location.

- Equipment : We can loan a device subject to funding where groups fulfil the criteria (we do however, currently have a waitlist). Hi-Vis jackets, signs and training will be provided.
- Monitoring : We would expect a minimum of two hours monitoring a week whenever possible. This can take place at any time during day light hours and subject to weather conditions. Volunteer safety is paramount and we ask you not to carry out monitoring during poor visibility or slippery road conditions.
- Objectives of CSW : To educate road users to speed restrictions and the effect that their speeding is having on local communities. All offenders recorded by CSW are processed by Essex Police and the car details are checked on the police system. A letter is sent for the first offence and second offence and on the third instance they are added to a tasking list to be dealt with by Essex Police Casualty Reduction department. Information provided may also be used for police intelligence.



Help for people from Ukraine and their sponsors

There is a lot happening locally with people welcoming family members through the Ukraine Family Scheme and also hosting visitors as part of the Ukraine Sponsorship Scheme. At the time of writing there are 29 confirmed matches of sponsors and guest families within the Maldon District.

Good networks are building up within our towns and villages of people preparing to welcome guests to their homes as they work out the practicalities, including visa applications, having their homes checked by Maldon District Council and finding schools. Through social media and attending meetings we are aware of many offers of wider support for families when they arrive including help with translation, language lessons, social groups, and sports and activities for the children.

The Migrant and Refugee Community Hub will have had its first meeting on 26th April at the Fullbridge Church in Heybridge. Information packs, local to the Maldon District, in both Ukrainian and English are being produced to cover many of the issues likely to arise.

Recipe of the month

Spiced egg & coriander mayonnaise vol-au-vent filling

Preparation time: 20 mins

Cooking time: 7 minutes

Fills 10 vol-au-vent cases



Ingredients

- 10 vol-au-vent cases
- 3 eggs, hard-boiled and peeled
- 4 tablespoons of mayonnaise
- 2 teaspoons mild curry powder
- 4 spring onions finely chopped
- 2 tablespoons chopped coriander
- 400g tin chopped tomatoes
- squeeze of lemon juice
- mango chutney to serve

Method

1. Put the eggs in a bowl and roughly crush into small pieces with a fork. Mix in the mayonnaise, curry powder, spring onions, coriander, lemon juice and some seasoning. Chill until ready to use.
2. Divide between 10 vol-au-vent cases, sprinkle with coriander leaves and top with a small dollop of mango chutney.

Ministry Team Message for June

We can easily be caught off guard by the beauty of the earth. We need to stop and look up at the wonders around us. An Acer in the garden has transformed from little maroon leaflets over night into a tree in full glory coated in a blaze of shimmering copper red. Seeing the most intense blue sky up through the branches of a pink cherry blossom tree. It is all too easy to miss the beauty of the earth in the general rush of getting back to 'normal life' post the pandemic.

Our attempts to return to some kind of 'normal' are constrained by a developing domestic economic crisis generated by a combination of internal & global factors that have arisen during the pandemic, and which is now compounded by the tragedy that is Ukraine.

A year ago I wrote about charity, where and who do we support? I illustrated the work of the Mothers Union contributing to countries by targeting practical ways through education and support. I was therefore saddened that, within weeks, the UK overseas aid to poor countries was reduced.

Ukraine and Russia combined are the largest global grain producers and any loss, alternatively reduction, in this year's harvest (e.g. the inability to apply fertilisers will reduce yields by 50%) is expected to seriously impact poor nations throughout the world. Here in the UK, with inflation forecast to reach 10% by the end of the year, many UK families and pensioners will also struggle to get by.

So as one of the richest nations in the world we are facing difficult questions on how to support the hungry wherever they are, both at home & abroad! Throughout the pandemic, poorer families in the UK have had to rely on help from food banks, etc. but due to inflation and ever increasing demand for their services, the food banks too are struggling to meet demand.

The global refugee crisis continues to grow with migrations from Africa, the Middle and Far East augmented by large numbers of women & children displaced by the Russian invasion of Ukraine. Ukrainian refugees now are being offered convoluted visa procedures so that they may eventually travel to the UK, whereas no such provisions are offered to those migrants camped in Calais & Boulogne.

By declaring migrants willing to risk their lives crossing the channel in overcrowded inflatable boats as "illegal" with no recourse to join family members in the UK, a more humane solution is needed. The proposed Rwanda solution seems wrong and the Church has spoken out very clearly over this. Human rights and refugee organisations have also criticised the plans.

As Christians we are facing a double whammy, how to help people displaced around the world by 'war & famine' and, at the same time relieve suffering at home.


